- 3. Length: Research articles should be between 2000 to 6,000 words in length, including references, tables, and figures.
- 4. Abstract: Abstract must include 200–300-words, provide 3-6 keywords, submissions should be in Microsoft Word format (.docx), Times New Roman for English, Kalpurush for Bengali and Unicode Mongal Front for Sanskrit 1.5 spacing with 12 font size.
- 5. Style: Authors should follow the APA style guide (7th edition) for formatting and referencing and use 10 font size with 1.0 spacing.
- 6.
